Harvest Festival will once again showcase downtown Clear Lake with a celebration of wine, art and relaxing live music. Each year, the entire downtown area is transformed into a fun & festive fall atmosphere featuring a variety of musical entertainment, tastings of choice wines and an opportunity to browse the antique and specialty shops, restaurants and art galleries of our charismatic lake community.

Activities for the day will include wine-samplings, an expanded Farmers Market, unique vendors, seminars/demonstrations and, of course, great food. The wines will feature something for everyone, ranging from good affordable wines to library selections. 


