



Second Annual Lake Leadership Program Invites Applications

Applications are now being accepted for the second annual class of the Clear Lake Area Chamber's Lake Leadership program. The application is due September 12th.

Lake Leadership has provided the Clear Lake area with a network of current and emerging leaders who posses skills and sense of commitment to keep our community moving forward.

Lake Leadership begins with an orientation luncheon on September 17th, with the actual program beginning in October and going through April. There will also be a special graduation luncheon in May. The program uses the community as its classroom. Members meet monthly for briefings, tours and networking opportunities. Curriculum is developed with the idea of creating an integral, total experience. The topics are designed to be interactive, stimulating and thought-provoking. Participants are expected to also share their

The Clear Lake Area Chamber of Commerce and its Lake Leadership Committee encourage all community-minded, committed citizens who have an interest in learning more about the community in depth, its challenges and how they can shape Clear Lake's future to give serious consideration to participating in this year's Lake Leadership program. Cost of the program, to cover lunches, and in many cases, transportation is \$200 for Chamber members and \$250 for non-Chamber members.
